Child-Centered Play Therapy (Level I) 2026

Attend 3 days online and 3 days on-site in Rijeka, Croatia!

The training represents the theoretical study and practice of the Play Therapy model called Child-Centered Play Therapy (CCPT).

CCPT is one of the longest-running, most effective and most frequently used forms of Play Therapy. With strong scientific evidence and broad applicability, it is for children 2.5 to 12 years old one of the most developmentally appropriate therapeutic interventions with respect to a very wide range of issues including anxiety, AD/HD, chronic illness, social difficulties, behavioral and attachment problems, depression, loss and trauma.

The skills on which CCPT is based are also extremely useful when practicing directive Play Therapy methodologies. This approach is also the basis of the family Play Therapy intervention called Filial Therapy.

Among the various models originating from the pioneering work of Virginia Axline, the one presented in this course refers to the methodology developed by Guerney-VanFleet.

The training program as a whole is dedicated to the study and practice of CCPT. It allows participants to learn what the rationale behind this model is, the goals, how to select play materials, learn about and apply the skills and methods that are used during the play session, recognize play themes, interpret them,

and finally consider several specific issues inherent in the practice. In addition, the program reviews issues concerning the general framing of Play Therapy and Therapeutic Play as therapeutic and educational areas of intervention and parenting training.

Upon completion of the training program, participants will be able to competently conduct CCPT sessions.

Module I) Introduction to Play Therapy (1 day online)

Deepen the relevance of play from a developmental and therapeutic point of view. Know in a sufficiently articulate way the wide world of Play Therapy and Therapeutic Play and identify the main theoretical models and intervention tools.

+ <u>post-test</u> (multiple-choice and open-ended questions) due within 48 hours after the end of the module.

Module II) Introduction to Child-Centered Play Therapy (CCPT) (1 day online) & Study and Practice of CCPT (3 days in-person in Rijeka)

- 1. Describe the principles of Virginia Axline.
- 2. Apply the four main skills of the CCPT methodology.
- 3. Discuss a variety of possible situations in play sessions.
- 4. Explain the role of physical contact during the CCPT session.
- 5. Use CCPT with children in an immediate way.
- 6. Describe at least four different situations/problems for which CCPT can be used.
- 7. Discuss the relevance of the playroom setting in accordance with the methodology and the client's needs.
- 8. Explain the relevance of play themes that arise during a CCPT session.
- 9. Compile post-session notes indicating the connection between the child's behavior, play themes and the goals of the therapeutic process.
- 10. Discuss levels of play interpretation and which of these are appropriate in CCPT sessions.
- 11. State at least two reasons why aggressive toys are important in the room.
- 12. Describe the four stages commonly observed in the CCPT pathway.
- 13. Identify the reasons (or when) a CCPT process can be considered completed.
- + <u>internship</u> of at least 10 sessions with 1 child and written report (detailed information is provided by training officers at a later stage). Sessions with the child can be done in the native language.

Module III) Involving Parents in Child-Centered Play Therapy (1 day online)

To deepen the study of parenting skills and strategies consistent with the CCPT model to facilitate and consolidate Child-Centered Play Therapy intervention and as a tool to effectively support parents in preventing and managing problems and conflicts with their children.

+ <u>post-test</u> (multiple-choice and open-ended questions) due within 48 hours after the end of the module.

Module IV) Individual Supervision (3 hours online)

For the purposes of revisiting and consolidating CCPT skills, covering special topics, and obtaining the final certificate, each participant is required to make a 60-minute <u>individual</u> <u>supervision</u> meeting (on a date to be agreed upon with the supervisor) and then (on another agreed upon date) a 45-minute <u>oral presentation</u> supported by written documentation and video clips of the play sessions and with feedback from the trainers/supervisors for a total of maximum 120 minutes (including the 45-minute presentation).

NOTE: All training participants are <u>invited</u> (but not required) to take part in all colleague <u>presentations</u>.

Recipients

The training is open to professionals working in the developmental field who have a degree (or equivalent title) in one of the following areas: **mental health, educational, health, rehabilitation or social work**. For professionals outside the mental health field, enrollment in the training program is possible if the methodology is applied within their discipline and activities are carried out in conjunction with a mental health professional.

Method

Teaching includes presentation of theoretical material, video and live demonstrations, case studies, supervision and feedback of participants' work during activities and simulations. All carried out in a playful and positive learning atmosphere. The CCPT study module (II) is limited to 6 participants per trainer to allow for extended skill practice with individualized feedback and coaching.

Program

The entire training includes a total of **39 hours** (6 days + 3 hours) divided as follows:

•	Introduction to Play Therapy	6 hours online
•	Introduction to Child-Centered Play Therapy (CCPT)	6 hours online
•	Study and Practice of CCPT	18 hours in-person
•	Involving Parents in the Play Therapy Process	6 hours online
•	Individual Supervision	3 hours online

Each participant, after taking CCPT Module II, is required to conduct an **internship** that includes at least 10 play sessions with 1 child and related written and video documentation. Participants will be asked to conduct the internship in the context of their professional field. Finding the child/family to follow in the internship is the responsibility of the participant.

Cost & Discounts

The training program has a total cost of € 890.

Certificate

Participants must consider 100% class attendance (any absences due to exceptional events must be reported promptly and in any case made up by the participant according to the arrangements decided by the training managers), the conduct and passing of all post-tests and practical training.





The trainers reserve the right to ask the participant to conduct additional individual supervision meetings for the purpose of reaching the minimum level of skills required for obtaining the Certificate. In such cases, the Academy guarantees the subsidized rate of € 40 / hour for up to 5 additional hours of supervision. Upon completion, the Academy (APT Approved Provider #20-602 and APTI Approved Provider #15-001) issues a **Child-Centered Play Therapy Level I Certificate**.

The number of 18 Contact Play Therapy Credit Hours and 18 Non-Contact Play Therapy Credit Hours competes for **mental health professionals** to obtain or renewing Registered Play Therapist (RPT)
